WINTER GRITTING: VOLUNTEERS SOUGHT

We are grateful to the team of volunteers who have assisted our in gritting major pathways in the village during cold weather. This activity is vital to maintaining the accessibility of targeted areas of the village. Volunteers are sought for this year's Winter Gritting Scheme. Full training will be provided. Anyone interested should contact the Parish Clerk or call into the office at the Jubilee Reading Room on any weekday morning.



The Dial-a-ride service is open to anyone in the village - there are no age or mobility restraints and costs just £5 return (£2.50 with bus pass). The Parish Council has been funding the service
